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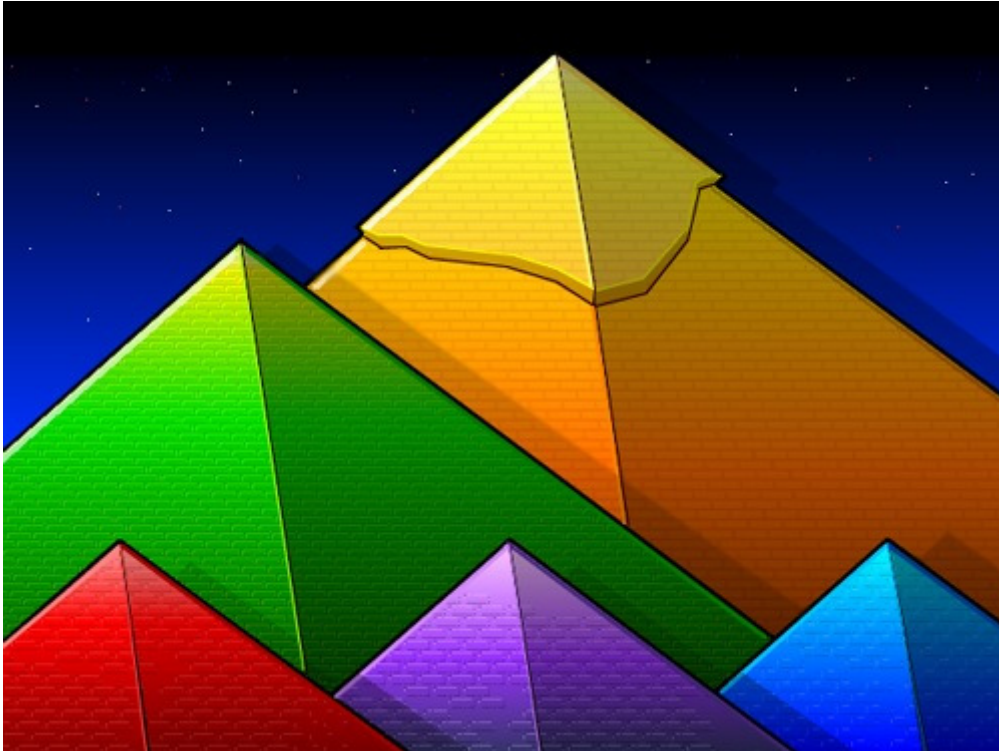
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***Pyramid Power – Wow!*** © 2000 – by Neal McKenna

Pyramids are definitely awe inspiring – majestic, monumental, not to mention mysterious. Their true purpose, from our typical standpoint, is lost to antiquity. Many say: “if it looks like a duck and quacks like a duck, chances are, it *is* a duck.” That’s the stance many archeologists take. – The pyramids are merely opulent grave markers, paying homage to once living gods. Then, there’s the celestial connection, where theorists postulate that the pyramids of the Valley of the Kings occupy the same configuration as the stars in the belt of Orion. Is it possible they serve as a beacon calling extraterrestrial visitors back to planet Earth? Well, as Johnny Mathis once mused, it’s not for me to say.

But there’s still more to pyramid lore than mummies’ tombs and inter-stellar hailing devices. There are those who profess pyramids generate measurable energy fields. Though not necessarily mystical power, it is power, nonetheless. It has to do with tachyons and tardyons, two invisible forms of energy reputed to be capable of moving at the speed of light or close to it. Though it sounds like something straight out of a 1930s

Universal Studios fright-flick, starring Boris Karloff, there may be some basis in scientific fact to this so-called phenomenon!

Tachyons are hypothetical energy particles accounted for in Einstein's Theory of Relativity – you know –  $E=mc^2$ ? They, theoretically, have the ability to pass through solid matter, zinging along faster than the speed of light. “Tachy” is Greek for “*speedy*.” On the other hand, tardyons are invisible but proven energy particles which move slower than 186,000 miles per second. Compared to their hypothetical-fleeter-than-light counterparts tardyons *are* – well, tardy – but then again, they're anything but slow. This juxtapositioning of energies gives rise to the theory of *negative space-time*.

– But first, let's get a handle on what positive space-time is. Positive space-time theory, maintains living things and even inanimate objects, pass from prime condition to a state of deterioration, ending in total decay. Yes, that pretty much describes the aging process in my house. However, the theory of negative space-time holds that objects and living things can repair from deterioration to a state of rejuvenation. Believers of pyramid power hold that the pyramid shape acts as a focus, attracting high concentrations of tardyons. They maintain the pyramid shape serves as an interface between positive and negative space-time. So, if the theory actually works in the real world, anything placed within the pyramid shape – from fresh produce to dull razor blades – should gain the rejuvenating benefits of concentrated tardyon bombardment.

According to **Dr. Patrick Flannigan** in his book “*Pyramid Power: the Millennium Science*,” one particular dairy in Italy packages its milk in pyramid shaped containers and the producers claim their milk will remain sweet indefinitely without refrigeration. Believers also insist that frozen foods can regain their “natural fresh” flavour if they are allowed to defrost within a pyramid shape. **Bill Kerrell**, in his “*Basic Pyramid Experimental Guide Book*,” said the following: “Frozen meat defrosted under a pyramid shape regained the flavor of fresh meat. Through numerous experiments, fresh meats were divided, with half placed inside a pyramid shape for one hour prior to cooking while the remainder was kept aside. Blind taste tests followed and the “treated” meat samples always proved to be more flavourful and tender than the meat kept outside the pyramid's influence.”

Kerrell's further experimentation with fresh bread exposed to the pyramid affect led to the following conclusions. “In our research, we have kept bread in its original store wrapper under a pyramid in excess of seven weeks with it remaining just as fresh as the day we bought it. We never used bread with added preservatives in our tests. Placing your flour, rice, beans, etc., in a pyramid will discourage bugs from invading these items. The high dehydration rate [within the pyramid] kills small insect pests.”

Stephen Cipes, a very successful vintner in Kelowna, British Columbia is a true believer in pyramid power. He has built an 8% replica of the pyramid of Cheops aligned to true north at Summerhill, his estate winery. The pyramid's purpose? To age and store wines produced at the Summerhill Winery. Definitely a fanciful fixture at the vineyard, it may conceivably be at least one factor in Summerhill's success story. For the last several years Summerhill Wines has consistently won awards for excellence, taking gold medals for the best red, white, sparkling, and dessert wines. In British Columbia, since the early 90s, Cipes bruit champenoise sparkling wine has out-sold all other champagnes combined – including those originating in France's Champagne province.

Does the pyramid have anything to do with this success? “I certainly think so,” says Cipes. “The pyramid shape creates a receptacle which is conducive to the creation and accumulation of negative ions. Negative ions have been proven to increase brain activity. That’s why people feel so energized after taking a shower or being caught in a rain storm.” Visitors to Summerhill’s pyramid often remark on the “tingling feeling” they experience when they are inside the structure. Others comment on the feeling of serenity they experience inside the pyramid’s storage chamber.

So, there you have it! Something is obviously afoot and it’s easy to start conducting your own pyramid power experiments. All you have to do is construct a pyramid. And no, you don’t have to go to the great lengths Cheops or even Stephen Cipes have gone. What the pyramid shape is constructed of really doesn’t seem to matter, just as long as it’s not made of metal. So, you can fashion your own pyramid with anything from plain cardboard to Popsicle sticks. It doesn’t seem to matter to the tardyons – all they’re looking for is a pyramid shaped focal point so they can gather and work their magic.
